

Points in Common with 2014 Proposals

The main point of our proposals contained in the “2014 White Paper on the Chinese Economy and Japanese Companies” is to secure “non-discrimination.” Details of proposals are classified into the following three categories:

1. Development of rules of the market-oriented economy and adequate implementation (the improvement of a modern market system)

In order to build a market mechanism ensuring orderly competition, we request that you abolish or review various regulations that impede fair competition and strengthen the protection of intellectual property rights.

2. Loosening of excessive government regulations (the transformation of government functions)

In order to build a government that is ruled by law and that is more service intensive, we request that you simplify and speed up administrative procedures and abolish the administrative approval or certificate system currently required for economic activities that are usually adjusted based on the effective market mechanism.

3. Equal treatment of domestic and foreign companies and application of global standards (the establishment of a new open economy system)

In order to respond to globalization of the economy, we request that you reduce restrictions on the entry of foreign companies in manufacturing and servicing sectors and apply global standards furthermore.
